

## **Guidelines for writing and Submission of abstract -papers in WAVES Conference**

You may be interested in presenting and submitting paper in WAVES 15<sup>th</sup> International and 26<sup>th</sup> India Conference to be held from 23<sup>rd</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> December, 2022.

Here are few guidelines that enable us in compiling souvenir and proceedings in much easier way –

1. Mention your name, designation, affiliation, contact no and email address on your abstract as well as on paper.
2. Abstract's and paper's filename should only have author's name, eg. Shilpa Sharma (without Dr./Prof./Ms./Mr. and title of paper ).
3. Submit abstract and paper in both formats- word and PDF.
4. For English use font "Times new roman" with single space. Keep font size of title in 14 and running matter of abstract and paper in 12.
5. For Devanagri use Unicode font with single space. Keep font size of title in 16 and of running matter point 14.
6. If possible, kindly use diacritical markings (specifically in paper).
7. Word limit for abstract maximum 300 words.
8. Word limit for paper maximum 5000 words.
9. For references in abstract write full Rigveda, Athrvaveda (No abbreviations are required). In numbers, kindly follow –Rigveda 1.1.1 (use dot instead of /).
10. For references in paper follow –
  - Instead of footnotes write endnotes
  - Use abbreviations in endnotes
  - Write Ibid./ वही, if same as previous line in endnotes
  - Format for secondary books in endnotes – author name, book name, publisher name, place and year of publication, Volume (if any), page no. Few examples – Keith and Macdonell, *Vedic Index*, MLBD, Delhi, 2007 (reprint), Vol. I, p. 54 / विश्वेश्वर नाथ, ऋग्वेद पर एक ऐतिहासिक दृष्टि, नाग प्रकाशक, दिल्ली, १९६७, पृ. २००
